## 3. Glaring Lack of Options in 2014 Judicial Elections

The ballot for November's state

judicial elections is set, and there will be little choice for voters when it comes to selecting Illinois' judges.

Only 11 of 30 downstate judicial races feature more than one candidate this year, and in Cook County, 25 out of 26 judges are running unopposed.

How does this happen? Well, for starters the March primary election had the lowest turnout of any Illinois primary in the past 50 years. What to do? Make a point to get involved earlier, prior to the *next* primary election.

It's important to choose the most qualified person for the job, as judicial elections can have long-term impact: Many of the judges running unopposed will be on the bench for another *10 years*.
